1) General

Four Corridor representatives, five community representatives, one government and two guests attended the 23rd meeting of the Community Liaison Committee on Tuesday, November 3, 2009. Doug Bailey, Corridor's Production Operations Manager, chaired the meeting.

Minutes from the September 8, 2009 meeting were reviewed. The Outstanding Action Items from the previous meeting were discussed and new issues were identified.

The next Committee meeting will take place on Tuesday, January 12, 2010 at 7:00 pm at the Penobscis Fire Hall (please note location change).

2) Project Updates

Production:

Doug Bailey provided an update on production:

- Normal activity occurred at the gas plant except for a plant maintenance turnaround in mid September. Everything went according to plans with the turnaround.
- The work on the G-48 (Moffett) well pad is finishing with the final piping almost complete.

Drilling:

Doug Bailey provided an update on drilling:

- There has been no drilling activity since the last meeting.
- Nabors Rig 86 has returned to Alberta.
- Nabors Rig 58 is still being stored at the I-39 (Folkins) well pad off the Marvin Farm Road.

Completions:

Doug Bailey provided an update on completions:

- The work-over on G-48 is nearing completion. They will move on to G-41 (Elgin) well pad during the week and after that may move on to O-76 (Tait) well pad.

Seismic:

- At the end of the meeting, Paul Durling gave a very informative presentation on the Micro-seismic Monitoring Project.

HSE & Sponsorship:

Dena Murphy gave an update on HSE and the Sponsorship:

- Corridor held an Emergency Response Training and Table Top Exercise in October that was facilitated by Randy Robinson of the EMO New Brunswick and Margaret Leahey Consulting. This session proved to be very beneficial and was attended by Corridor representatives, Sussex Fire Department, RCMP, Ambulance New Brunswick, Potash Corp New Brunswick, Village of Sussex Corner and DNR.
- Since the last CLC meeting, despite best efforts the following incidents occurred:
 - 2 First Aids in September – pipe wrench slipped and struck a contractor; contractor slipped off a casing valve and sprained his ankle.
 - 1 Accidental release in November – 20 litres of antifreeze spilled at G-41 Well Pad in Elgin.
 - All incidents were investigated, corrective actions assigned and implemented as appropriate, and required regulatory reports were made.
- Sponsorship donations awarded since the last meeting include: Town of Sussex Ice Sponsorship Program, Christmas Daddies, Kidstuff Theatre, Sussex Kiwanis Club and the Crosswinds Occupational Activity Center. There are still 9 or 10 sponsorship applications under review and decisions will be made by mid to late November so that the funds can be processed and awarded prior to the holiday break.

3) Update on Action Items and New Issues

- **Well pad signs** – It was suggested that our well pad signs be posted with no Hunting near well pads. *ACTION:* The design of the well pad signs is currently being reviewed so this is an option to consider if changes are made in 2010
