## Community Liaison Committee

The Community Liaison Committee held its third meeting for 2010 on May 11. There were two Corridor representatives, one government representative, four community members and three guests from the community in attendance.

Updates were given on Production, Drilling, Completions, Health Safety & Environment (HSE) and Sponsorship. An inquiry was made as to whether Corridor would be proceeding with the storage at Cassidy Lake. Corridor continues to evaluate the project, but there are no current plans. One of the issues raised was air quality and monitoring.

As a follow-up to the air monitoring issue raised in the last meeting, representatives from the Department of Environment gave a presentation to the Committee on June 8 to discuss flaring, air emissions and monitoring. The presentation demonstrated that there were minimal to no impacts from Corridor's flaring activities.

The next meeting will take place on Tuesday, September 14 at 7:00 pm at the Penobscis WI Hall. If you have any questions or would like to receive a copy of the minutes, please contact Nancy Secord at 433-3066.

## Sponsorship Update

Corridor has received eight sponsorship requests from Penobscis and the surrounding areas since the last newsletter. Requests still under review are from: Dairy Town Classic; Sussex Vale Transition House, Atlantic International Balloon Fiesta; and Sussex Classics Under 13 Girls Basketball.

Corridor has made a decision regarding the scholarship recipients for this year. We will highlight the winning recipients in our August newsletter.

## Drilling and Completions Update

### Drilling

The Nabors Drilling Rig #58 has been moved from Penobsquis to the Elgin area to commence drilling operations for Apache Canada. They will be using the rig over the coming 3 to 5 months for their drilling campaign. No other activities are

planned until early fall when the Sally's Brook well located off Lewiston Road will be drilled.

### Completions

The completion activities on the L-37 well near the McCully Gas Plant have been completed and the well will be tested over the coming months. No other completion activities are planned in the near term.

## Production Operations Update

### Plant and Field Operations

The gas plant and production facilities have been operating normally over the last two months.

### McCully Expansion

- Plans to expand the McCully Gas Plant are on schedule. The expansion includes the addition of a new inlet slug catcher and new process compressor. The new equipment is scheduled to arrive mid-July and the plant expansion is expected to be complete in early Fall 2010.
- The tie-in of the D-48 Well Pad to connect the L-37 well may take place once the well is completed.

## Seismic Activity Update

- No seismic activities have occurred since the last edition of the newsletter.

## Safety and Environment

During the past two months, the QHSE Department has been very busy providing support for production operations in New Brunswick, planned drilling activities on Anticosti Island in Québec and a proposed geohazard survey offshore Newfoundland in anticipation of future drilling in the area. The QHSE Manager attended the Enform Petroleum Safety Conference in May in Alberta where major conference themes included safety leadership, contractor safety, supervisor competency and journey

management. Safety Leadership training was run in Penobsquis and Halifax for all Corridor staff and managers. Corridor held a preliminary meeting in Penobsquis with First Responders to discuss the upcoming field Emergency Response exercise currently planned for September. Corridor representatives also attended the Activity Update in Elgin held by its partner, Apache Canada. There have been no spills or injuries since the last edition of the newsletter.
