1) General

Three project representatives from Corridor Resources/AMEC and six community representatives attended the seventh meeting of the Community Liaison Committee on May 14, 2007, at the Penobsquis Fire Hall. Doug Bailey, Productions Operation Manager chaired the meeting. Guests included: Austin Yeomans and Beth McQuinn, residents of Penobsquis.

Minutes from the April 16, 2007 Community Liaison Committee were reviewed and an omission noted on the discussion of rig lights shining in the windows. The Minutes from the previous meeting will be updated to address the omission. The Outstanding Action Items from the previous meeting were discussed and new issues were identified.

The next Committee meeting will take place on Monday, June 11, 7:00 pm at the Penobsquis Fire Hall.

2) Project Updates

Lance Reid, the on-site Construction Manager for the McCully Stage 2 Development Project, gave an update on the Project.

The transmission line and gathering systems have been tested and are now in the process of drying out. Restoration has started on some of the agricultural land and the bulk of the restoration will be done during the July/August timeframe (weather dependent).

The plant contractors have downsized their staff as parts of the plant are turned over to Corridor for commissioning. Power is now available to the entire plant and testing is expected to be done the weekend of May 19 on the plant compressor skids.

Corridor's operators and six commissioning people are working on calibrating instruments, doing leak tests and getting the plant and well sites ready for start-up in mid June with full operation scheduled for the end of June.

3) Update on Action Items and New Issues

- **Equipment Vandalism** – A question was raised wanting to know if there had been any vandalism to equipment in Cornhill or Knightville areas. *ACTION: RB Somerville has reported to Ken Chapman that there has been high number of theft including batteries, diesel fuel and a light pole. Corridor received a copy to two property damage reports from RB Sommerville. The first from the Havelock/New Canaan area for two stolen batteries from equipment and the other from Penobsquis/Knightville area for vandalism to excavation equipment.*
- **Waddy Property** – It was suggested that a guard rail be put on the Waddy Road as there is a 60-80 ft. drop on one corner. *ACTION: Lance will have a guard rail ordered for that part of the road. The guard rail is ordered and will be installed in a couple of weeks.*
- **L-38 Well Location** – There was concern that if there is to be a second well drilled in this location throughout the summer that noise will be an issue. On two occasions already one resident has had to close windows on a warm night due to noise from the rig.
- **Scholarships** – The Committee would like to have some information available on the scholarships for the next meeting. *ACTION: The Board of Directors has approved \$10,000 to be spent in the school system for scholarships and awards. A committee member expressed appreciation to Corridor for making this happen.*
- **Noise Monitoring** – Monitoring has been done during construction and drilling but there is no baseline to follow. Corridor would like to get a baseline to compare the monitoring as there has been a large variability in the sound levels. The monitoring equipment malfunctioned this week during noise sample testing. The testing will be redone next week. *Note: This rig is now shutdown and noise monitoring will be done for the next couple of weeks to create a baseline for comparison.*
- **Student Employment** – Corridor has hired a 3rd year Co-Op engineering student for four months.
- **O-76 Well Location** – Visitors to this location looking for employment are being treated rudely. *ACTION: Larry to address problem. The drilling manager has spoken to the staff and this should not be a problem in the future.*
- **Public water system** – A request was made that Corridor help residents with the costs of the public water system because the seismic may have contributed to the loss of water in the area. *RESPONSE: Doug Bailey stated that Corridor had reviewed this and could not find a correlation between the Corridor seismic and the water issue. A committee member suggested that rather than blaming Corridor, maybe a request for corporate support would be more appropriate.*
- **Topics for future meetings** – Doug asked the committee for topic ideas for future meetings. The one from the previous month on drilling was well received. *Recommendations were made for seismic and plant presentations.*
