**1) General**

Three project representatives from Corridor Resources and six community representatives attended the eighth meeting of the Community Liaison Committee on June 11, 2007, at the Penobsquis Fire Hall. Jamie Daley chaired the meeting. Terry Bannister, a resident of Penobsquis, was a guest at the meeting.

Minutes from the May 14, 2007 Community Liaison Committee were approved. The Outstanding Action Items from the previous meeting were discussed and new issues were identified.

The next Committee meeting will take place on Monday, July 9, 7:00 pm at the Penobsquis Fire Hall.

**2) Project Updates**

In absence of Lance Reid, Doug Bailey gave a Project update.

The transmission line and gathering systems have the final tie-ins being completed. The work on the well pads is being completed and the plant is now being commissioned. The final leak tests are being done at the plant and the well pads will have their leak testing done after the plant is finished.

It is anticipated that gas will flow around June 25, with anticipated gas sales by the end of June.

The cleanup along the pipelines is being put out to bid to give the local contractors an opportunity for the contract.

### 3) Update on Action Items and New Issues

- **Waddy Property** – It was suggested that a guard rail be put on the Waddy Road as there is a 60-80 ft. drop on one corner. *ACTION: Lance will have a guard rail ordered for that part of the road. The guard rail is now installed.*
- **L-38 Well Location** – There was concern that if there is to be a second well drilled in this location throughout the summer that noise will be an issue. On two occasions already one resident has had to close windows on a warm night due to noise from the rig. *The second hole will commence drilling mid month.*
- **Scholarships** – The Committee would like to have some information available on the scholarships for the next meeting. The Board of Directors has approved \$10,000 to be spent in the school system for scholarships and awards. A committee member expressed appreciation to Corridor for making this happen. *Update: The scholarship information was given to the local high schools in Sussex and Petitcodiac. The schools were requested to choose students from the areas of the Penobscis through to Havelock that includes areas of the pipeline, well pad and gas plant. Students should be pursuing post secondary education; either university or college, in the science or engineering fields and have a strong academic background. At the time of the meeting, the only feedback from the schools was to clarify the location criteria for the scholarships. Donations were also given to the Middle and Elementary schools for achievement awards.*
- **Noise Monitoring** – Corridor is still waiting for the noise monitoring reports from the consultant.
- **Topics for future meetings** – Doug asked the committee for topic ideas for future meetings. The one from the previous month on drilling was well received. Recommendations were made for seismic and plant presentations. *Update: A notice will go out to the public when dates are decided.*
- **Plant Tour** – Corridor would like to give the committee members a plant tour. It was suggested that this be done on a regular meeting night.
- **Unsafe Driving** – It was reported that a silver/grey 4-door 4x4 was traveling at a very fast speed at 7 pm on Monday evening, June 4 and turned off Route 114 to the gas plant road. *ACTION: Doug Bailey reminded the employees the importance of safe driving and following speed limits.*
- **Corridor Website** – The Committee was asked if they had any problem with the agendas, minutes, presentations, etc. being posted on the new website. They had no problems as long as the names of the Committee members who raised issues were not included in the minutes on the website.
