1) General

Two project representatives from Corridor Resources and three community representatives attended the ninth meeting of the Community Liaison Committee on July 9, 2007, at the Penobscis Fire Hall. Doug Bailey, Production Operations Manager, chaired the meeting.

Minutes from the June 11, 2007 Community Liaison Committee were approved. The Outstanding Action Items from the previous meeting were discussed and new issues were identified.

The next Committee meeting will take place on Monday, September 10, 7:00 pm at the Penobscis Fire Hall. A plant tour is tentatively scheduled for the Community Liaison Committee during the September 10 meeting. Further details will follow and committee members will be notified in advance.

2) Project Updates

A project update was given by Doug Bailey. The plant began production on June 28 at approximately 80% capacity. There are 5 wells producing and the others are slowly being brought on-line. The five producing wells are: J-67 (Vanderlaan property) – 1; M-66 (Wallace property) – 2; J-65 (Lynch property) – 1; and B-67 (MacLeod property) -1. Flaring at the gas plant should end once the start-up phase is completed. Commissioning of the large compressor is scheduled to be begin on July 23, but it will not be placed into regular operation until later.

The pipeline additions are still under review by the NB Department of Environment and the NB Energy and Utilities Board. Construction will not be scheduled until all the necessary permits are obtained.

3) Update on Action Items and New Issues

- **L-38 Well Location** – The second well at this site is now into its fourth week of drilling. A question was asked as to the meaning of the horns that go off. Sometimes they are quiet and other times they are very loud. *ACTION: Doug to follow-up on this issue.*

- **Scholarships** – The Committee wanted to know who the scholarships recipients were, but all the names were not available at the time of the meeting. *NOTE: The recipients of the scholarships are as follows: Erin Carson of Havelock (\$2000) – University of Moncton - Faculty of Science; Jonathan Good of Havelock (\$1500) – University of New Brunswick - Engineering; Alison Conley of Cornhill (\$1000) – Dalhousie University – Bachelor of Science; Daniel Hogan of Plumweseep (\$2000) – University of New Brunswick – Engineering; Melissa Secord of Penobsquis (\$1500) – Memorial University – Bachelor of Science; Colton Jonah (\$1000) – University of New Brunswick – Bachelor of Science.*
- **Noise Monitoring** – Corridor is expecting to have the noise monitoring results available for the next meeting.
- **Plant Tour** – Corridor would like to give the committee members a plant tour. It was suggested that this be done on a regular meeting night. *ACTION: A tentative tour is scheduled for September 10, 2007.*
- **Unsafe Driving** – It was reported that a silver/grey 4-door 4x4 was traveling at a very fast speed at 7 pm on Monday evening, June 4 and turned off Route 114 to the gas plant road. *ACTION: Doug Bailey reminded the employees the importance of safe driving and following speed limits.*
- **Corridor Website** – The Committee was asked if they had any problem with the agendas, minutes, presentations, etc. being posted on the new website. They had no problems as long as the names of the Committee members who raised issues were not included in the minutes on the website. *NOTE: The website is up and running and information on the Community Liaison Committee can be located in the “About Us” tab under Corporate Responsibility and Community Engagement.*
