**1) General**

Three Corridor representatives and eight community representatives attended the 13<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Community Liaison Committee on Monday, March 17, 2008. Doug Bailey, Corridor's Production Operations Manager, chaired the meeting. Guests included: George Daley, resident/Penobsquis Fire Department; Fred Van de Brand, resident; Terry Bannister, resident; and Wayne Bell, resident. Cathy Dubee from the Department of Environment was present and will now be in regular attendance at the meetings.

Minutes from the February 25, 2008 meeting were reviewed. The Outstanding Action Items from the previous meeting were discussed and new issues were identified.

It was decided that the next meeting will be a public Open House. Corridor will plan to provide updates on seismic, drilling and completions and production. In addition, Corridor will give other interested people the opportunity to become a member of the Community Liaison Committee. If you would like to become a regular member of the Committee and are unable to attend, please call Nancy Secord at 433-3066 and express your interest. Existing Committee members, who would like to remain on the Committee, may do so by attending the meeting or by calling Nancy to confirm your interest. The Open House will take place from 4 to 8 pm on Monday, April 28, 2008 at the Penobsquis Women's Institute.

## 2) Update on Action Items and New Issues

- **Water Testing** – The Committee would like information on the water tests (e.g., how many homes with bad water) that Corridor has been performing in fulfillment of its regulatory requirements. *ACTION: These test results are submitted to the NB Department of Environment, but are considered confidential. Corridor is in the process of compiling all this information internally and will endeavor to prepare a high level summary for the Committee.*
- **Sponsorship Program** – Dena Murphy provided an overview of the different organizations that have requested funds from Corridor for this quarter. This will be an ongoing update at the meetings.
- **Noise from Rig #86 on G-48 (Moffett) Well Pad** – There have been different noises coming from the drilling at the G-48 well pad. The pitch changes frequently and the noise is louder than usual. It was questioned as to whether there has been a change in the drilling technique and how long will the noise continue. A Committee member also asked if there is any noise monitoring planned for this location. Corridor does not have any specific noise monitoring planned for the G-48 well pad but future noise monitoring has not been ruled out. *ACTION: Doug Bailey to check on the noise from Rig#86.*
- **Traffic/littering on Canada Packers Road** – A comment was made that the traffic has slowed down but now there has been a noticeable amount of coffee cups along the road side. *ACTION: Dena Murphy to flag this issue with the Drilling Department for action.*

## 3) Project Updates

### Production:

A Production and Expansion Project update was given by Doug Bailey:

- J38 on the L-38 (McPhee) well pad testing should be completed by next week.
- D66 on the O-76 (Tait) well pad came into production on March 14.
- F-58 (Waddy) well pad is anticipated to be producing by the end of March.
- I67 on the N-57 (McQuinn) well pad is planned for production in early April.

### Drilling:

In early April, Rig #58 will be moving from the F-67 (Vanderlaan) well pad to the N-57 (McQuinn) well pad. The Department of Transportation has requested that the move be done at night when the temperatures are colder to minimize the road damage. Corridor will distribute a Notice to residents when the timing of the rig move is known.

### Seismic:

A Seismic update was given by Dena Murphy. Planning for the upcoming seismic program is underway. A study has been completed to determine the landowners within the 3D area. A contractor is designing the locations of the 3D seismic lines to meet the geophysical objectives of the survey. Preliminary contact has been made with geophysical contractors to assess availability and costs. Corridor will soon begin to discuss the program with regulatory agencies and seek approvals.

#### 4) **Incident Reports**

There were three accidental releases of synthetic oil based mud involving Corridor's contractors since the last meeting:

- February 28 – Nabors Rig #86 on the G-48 (Moffett) well pad - 1.5 m<sup>3</sup> were released
- March 9 – Nabors Rig #58 on the F-67 (Vanderlaan) well pad - 1.5 m<sup>3</sup> were released
- March 17 – Nabors Rig #58 on the F-67 (Vanderlaan) well pad - 100 L were released

All three accidental releases were contained to the area around the rig and were cleaned up. The Department of Environment was notified in each case and incident reports were submitted. Corridor investigated all three incidents to determine root cause and corrective actions to prevent a recurrence.
